Wonka Story

Tonight, we will be taking you through the journey of Willy Wonka becoming a chocolatier and how his family helped shape him into a creative chocolate maker by encouraging his pure imagination.

Willy Wonka arrives by boat and makes his way into town to visit the Galleries Gourmet with a hat full of dreams of establishing his own chocolate shop.

Wonka is persuaded to stay at Mrs. Scrubbitt's boarding house and unknowingly signs a predatory contract due to his illiteracy. Unable to pay the contract's unreasonably high fees, Wonka is forced to work in Scrubbitt's laundry room alongside her foster daughter, Noodle, and fellow captives Abacus, Piper, Larry, and Lottie. All of them are required to clean the laundry every day and scrub scrub.

Wonka and the laundry workers embark on a chocolate-selling adventure to reduce their debts. They are using the city's storm drains to escape the police. Wonka and friends are convincing the people to buy the chocolate because they have never had chocolate like this.

Wonka introduces "hoverchocs", which make the person eating them fly, but Chocolate shop rivals Arthur Slugworth, Gerald Prodnose, and Felix Fickelgruber want to stop Wonka and this Chocolate Cartel work with the police to prevent Wonka from selling chocolate. Wonka is a magical chocolatier.

Wonka finally opens his dream chocolate shop showcasing all of his creative designs including a chocolate river, edible flowers, and flavors that no one has ever tasted. He creates a world of your own inside his chocolate shop.

The Chocolate Cartel ask Scrubbitt to sabotage Wonka's chocolates and as a result, Wonka's customers become disfigured from the sabotaged chocolates and are outraged. Chaos begins, leading to the destruction of the shop. Wonka unwillingly accepts the Chocolate Cartel's offer to pay off everyone's debts in exchange for Wonka leaving town by boat. The laundry workers are released, but Slugworth pays Scrubbitt to keep Noodle indefinitely.

Wonka realizes that Noodle and Arthur Slugworth are related as he is talking to the Oompa Loompa Lofty. They realize the Chocolate Cartel has rigged the boat to explode. After escaping from the boat and rescuing Noodle, Wonka and his friends plan a strategy to obtain the Cartel's incriminating account book. The book is kept in the basement of the cathedral and is guarded by 500 monks.

The friends released a giraffe into the cathedral which caused the monks to leave and allowed Wonka and Noodle to enter the Chocolate Cartel's headquarters. However, the Chocolate Cartel finds Wonka and Noodle. Arthur Slugworth reveals that following the death of Noodle's father he lied to her mother Dorothy Smith that Noodle had died and he gave the newborn to Scrubbitt. The Chocolate Cartel makes Wonka and Noodle enter the chocolate reservoir and after locking Wonka and Noodle inside, they release more chocolate into the reservoir and Wonka and Noodle find themselves in a near death experience.

Wonka and Noodle nearly drown, but Lofty, the Oompa Loompa who is still seeking reimbursement from Wonka stealing his cocoa beans, rescues them. Wonka and Noodle expose the Chocolate Cartel's misdeeds, releasing their chocolate reserves into the city fountain ruining the Cartel's enterprise. The Chocolate Cartel floats up and out of the town, due to eating Wonka's hoverchocs.

Wonka reunites Noodle with her mother and purchases an abandoned castle that he transforms into his own chocolate factory, with Lofty the oompa loompa heading the tasting department. Wonka's friends return to their old lives.

Intermission

Charlie Bucket is a kind and loving boy who lives in poverty with his family near the Wonka Factory. Willy Wonka has long closed his factory to the public due to problems concerning spying which also caused all his employees, including Charlie's Grandpa Joe to lose their jobs. Wonka decides he needs to have an heir to take over his factory and decides to have a contest. He puts up posters around town and gets the wheels in motion.

Wonka announces this contest in which Golden Tickets have been placed in five random Wonka Bars worldwide, and the winners will receive a full tour of the factory as well as a lifetime supply of chocolate, while one will receive an additional prize at the end of the tour. Wonka's sales subsequently skyrocket, and the first four tickets are found by the candy loving boy Augustus Gloop, spoiled girl Veruca Salt, arrogant gum-chewing girl Violet Beauregarde, and TV loving boy Mike Teavee.

Charlie tries twice to find a ticket, but both bars come up empty. Charlie finds a banknote and purchases a third Wonka Bar at the local shop and he discovers the last ticket inside the wrapper. He receives monetary offers for the ticket, but the cashier warns him not to trade it regardless, and Charlie runs back home. At home, Charlie initially wants to trade the ticket for money for his family's betterment, but after a pep talk from his grandparents he decides to keep it, and brings Grandpa Joe to accompany him on the factory tour. Charlie is one lucky boy.

Charlie and the other ticket holder kids with their adults are greeted outside the factory by Wonka. They enter the factory and learn about the workers who are small orange people known as Oompa Loompas who worship the cocoa bean.

While inside the main candy room of the factory, Augustus Gloop gets overwhelmed with all the edible options. He begins eating the flowers and grass at which point he gets too close to the chocolate river and he falls in. The boy's mother gets worried and Wonka reassures her that he will be safe when the suction machine comes, taking the chocolate out of the river and taking August Gloop out of the chocolate.

The remaining kids and Wonka make their way to the inventing room where Wonka shows the kids how he has created the long lasting chewing gum. Violet immediately wants to try this new gum even though Wonka warns her that it is not ready yet. Violet does not care and starts chewing it anyway. After a couple minutes Violet gets to the blueberry pie flavor and starts to turn blue and swell up like a blueberry.

Wonka and the kids take a boat ride to the next factory room. On this boat ride they travel down the chocolate river passing multiple rooms of the factory showcasing all of the experimental candy flavors Wonka is creating. This becomes a wondrous boat ride.

They arrive at the squirrels room where the squirrels check each nut and if it is a bad nut they throw it down the garbage shoot. Veruca tells her dad she wants a squirrel & dad asks Wonka how much they cost, because what Veruca wants, she gets. Wonka says the squirrels are not for sale & Veruca gets upset and goes to grab one for herself as she yells I want it now!

The next room was the TV room. Wonka was starting to experiment with sending candy through the television which would allow children to get the candy out of their tv screen to eat it. Mike Teavee gets very interested and jumps in front of the machine which transports him into the TV. In the process, it shrinks him. Wonka has his oompa loompas take Mike and his parent to the stretching room where they stretch Mike back to his original size.

After the tour, the four eliminated children leave the factory while Charlie learns that Wonka wanted to find a kid to take over the factory. Since Charlie was the least ill-behaved of the five, Wonka invites Charlie to come live and work in the factory with him, provided that he leave his family behind. Charlie declines, as his family is the most important thing in his life. After some time, Wonka changes his mind and allows Charlie and his family to move into the factory together. Family is the secret ingredient to true happiness and creativity.
